

















CDM 2015: better co-ordination?

- 2 No




Historically permanent and temporary works designers have been intentionally separated to avoid overlapping liabilities.

This inevitably creates shortcomings in information flow.

FEEDBACK

Temporary works are still too often dealt with as a 'bolt on' rather than truly being integrated with the development of the permanent works design.
